In its first luncheon meeting of 2007, the Bremen Chamber of Commerce met on February 20, led by newly elected President Connie Moyer, who introduced the other new board members, which include Eric Mahler as vice president, Annamarie Qualls as secretary and Tracy Lecrone taking over responsibilities as treasurer.
