## Reminder of Ordinances

### Curfew

Ordinance 07-18-96 sets the curfew as follows:

Children under the age of 16 cannot be out between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. unless accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Children between the ages of 16 and 18 cannot be out between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. unless accompanied by a parent or guardian.

This curfew is being enforced. The deputies have taken several violators home, and further violations will result in fines.

### Loose Dogs

Please remember that dogs must be leashed, tied, or in a fenced yard.

Ordinances prohibit dogs running loose and also prohibit owners from allowing their animals to leave feces on others' property. If you have a dog, you must restrain it and clean up after it.

## St. There is still a stop for Mulberry St. Recycling Reminders

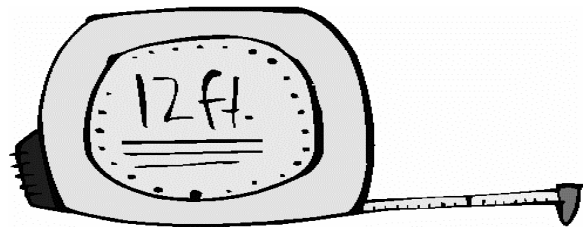


Recycling continues to be picked up on Wednesday mornings. If you need a tote so you can participate, you can pick one up at the Village Office. We accept all kinds of paper and cans, but only brown or clear bottles. We cannot take green glass or plastic. Keep up the good work in this area. So far this year, we have recycled 16,980 pounds of cardboard and paper and 471 pounds of aluminum.

Please remember to occasionally scrub out your recycling bins. If they are dirty or have offensive items in them, we will not take your recycling. Please note: **DIRTY DIAPERS AND USED PAPER PLATES AND CUPS ARE TRASH, NOT RECYCLING!**

### Summer Maintenance Reminders

Please remember to keep your grass mowed, trash picked up, and tires removed from your property. The Street Department will only pick up tree limbs and debris resulting from storm damage.



As you begin your summer projects, please remember that all construction requires a permit from the Village Office. This includes fences.

When measuring for construction, please remember that the dimensions on your lot description are to be measured from the center of the street and the center of the alley, not from the sidewalk. Sidewalks

have no bearing on property  
measurements.
