

Street Projects Update

Projects Affecting Strayer Avenue, Angle Street, Ford Street and Marietta Street

Village of Bremen, Ohio

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Introduction

Two projects are planned over the next two years that will provide safety improvements to the neighborhood area in the vicinity of Bremen Elementary School.

These projects will cause temporary inconveniences and disruptions to residents, businesses, pedestrians and motorists.


Village officials have initiated this newsletter for the purpose of apprising stakeholders about the projects. It will be issued periodically as new information becomes available.

The mailing list includes residents, property owners, businesses and institutions within the project area.

Other methods will also be used for updating the public including the Village of Bremen's Facebook Page and *The Village Voice* newsletter included with monthly utility bills.

What are the Projects?

- The first project will occur on Strayer Avenue and will replace the concrete curbs and gutters, plus replace stormwater catch basins. Construction is scheduled to start by late March 2015 (about a month from now) and will continue for several months. We are currently looking at options to shorten the construction period. More information and details will soon be available.
- The second project will replace and improve the sidewalks on Strayer Avenue and Angle Street, plus provide proper pedestrian crossings at key locations. It is being funded through Ohio Department of Transportation's Safe Routes to School program. This project is currently in the



Change of Traffic Pattern on Strayer Starting Next Week

Starting on Monday, March 2nd, Strayer Avenue will be switched to become one-way southbound, from Marietta Street to Angle Street.

It is believed that this will improve traffic flow and relieve congestion that typically occurs during the morning and afternoon school rush hours.

Ford Street will remain one-way westbound and Angle Street will still have two-way traffic.

engineering design phase. Construction is currently anticipated to occur in late 2016 to early 2017, depending on availability of the ODOT funding. Details about project impacts will be shared with the public and affected property owners as the project engineering further develops.
