<u>THOUGHTS</u>: I need your help... seriously... I hope to get several hundred responses to pass on to the Council.

The Village Council and several of our committees have been considering the worth of putting the issue of beer and wine sales back on the ballot. The considerations coming to the forefront are two-fold. One is to allow packaged sales of beer and wine for no on premise consumption. The other is to allow consumption on premises such as restaurants or possibly a sports bar.

The Village is only allowed (by the state liquor commission) to have 2 licenses for beer (C-1) and two licenses for wine (C-2). At the present, Jeff Qualls holds a C-1 and C-2 license under a "Pending Status". There is also a C-2 license pending under the name of My Little Market. That leaves one remaining C-1 license that is not committed to anyone. Until the Village passes to allow this all licenses remain on a pending status.

It is the same for allowing "on premises" consumption. There are two licenses available for both C-3 (beer) and C-4 (wine). These are not committed to anyone at the present. These licenses would allow a restaurant or other establishment to serve beer and wine to their customers.

Part of the rationale is that Dollar General and Outback Drive Thru already sell packaged sales and when the Sunoco moves up to the corner beside Dollar General they too will sell packaged sales. The Village is looking at annexation or a Joint Economic Development District with the Township so we can take advantage of income tax revenues. If we pass (by Village vote) and the Route 37 / Route 664 interchange becomes part of the Village then the existing licenses they hold will be protected by the Village vote. If they become part of the Village then their licenses come with them and are grandfathered in. However, the Village could take another vote and vote them dry. So if we pass having packaged sales then the businesses have nothing to fear by coming into the Village because the Village approved packaged sales.

The Zoning Commission raised the issue of having the opportunity for sales on premises. The rationale is that our restaurants or a sports bar would be able to have extended hours in the evening and on the weekends, keeping more business in Bremen. The truth is, most people wanting a nice meal with a glass of wine or beer have to travel to Lancaster, Logan or other outlying city. Would this keep more business in Bremen?

SO, HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT THESE ISSUES? THE COUNCIL WILL DECIDE WHETHER OR NOT TO PUT THE ISSUE(S) ON THE BALLOT BASED ON YOUR RESPONSES.

HAVE YOU TAKEN ADVANTAGE OF THE HOMESTEAD TAX BREAK???

The deadline to apply for the Homestead Tax Break is JUNE 2, 2014. Fairfield County Auditor said this might be the last chance for some homeowners to qualify for the property tax break. More than 10,500 homeowners in Fairfield County were enrolled in the Homestead Exemption Program last year. Those homeowners saw a reduction in their annual real estate taxes by an average of more than \$350.00.

Toni Harper, a Bremen Village resident said this affects any homeowner who is 65 or over. If you were 65 last year (2013) or before and haven't applied, you would apply as a late resident. There is NO INCOME LIMITATION. The Auditor's website explains it. Once on the Auditor's website, look at the AUDITOR NEWS and click on the Homestead Exemption article. That leads to the explanation. To access the application paper go to the strip of links in black at the top of the page. "Click" on Auditor's Office then "Homestead Exemption" in the pull down menu. You will need Adobe Reader to read it. If it doesn't load, try going to the top right of the page and "Click" on "Open with a different viewer" then click on "Open with Adobe Reader". If you don't have Adobe Reader, try saving it and opening it with whatever program you have. It is worth a try. Toni said it will save her \$300.00 per year on her property taxes and she would have never known it but for the article in the Eagle Gazette. Thank you Toni for sharing this information!!!

THOUGHT FROM THE VILLAGE TREE COMMISSION: As the cherry, dogwood and pear begin to bloom throughout the village, it makes for a beautiful backdrop, living in a tree lined community. We see the beautiful flowers and bright green sprouts, but underground, the roots are also growing... sometimes growing in places that can get them (the trees) in trouble! Residents with old clay sewer lines should take note to keep their lines in good working condition. If you have battled tree roots in your line, it is recommended by local plumbing companies that you should use copper sulfate available at the local Dollar General, use septic-safe toilet paper and don't dispose any "flushable" baby wipes in the toilet. Over the years, old clay lines can crack and break which is an open invitation for tree roots to invade the lines. Using copper sulfate is a good way to keep the roots at bay. Use or disposal of certain paper products in the sewer lines tend to get snagged or "hung up" in these old cracked or broken lines. By taking these preventative steps, we can enjoy the flowering trees, and not become frustrated by their roots. HUGE ODOT PROJECT TO GET UNDERWAY... The Ohio Dept. of Transportation has finalized their paving plans. Beginning April 7th they will start road repairs and by the first of May to be grinding and ready to pave. The project will run from Route 22 at Rushville, south on Route 664 all the way to the Hocking County line. Then ODOT will also add Route 312 from south of the Village to Route 93 in Hocking County. As much as I can, I will keep you posted as to when they plan on coming through the Village. Be prepared to use Bremen Road to Lake Road to Route 37 once construction commences. The work through the Village is at NO COST to the Village.

THERE WILL BE A PUBLIC GATHERING at the firehouse on April 27th from 2:00 pm until approximately 4:00 for residents on Strayer, Angle, and Ford Streets to learn about the new curb and gutter project on Strayer and traffic changes during the project. INCOME TAX INFORMATION: The Village is in contract with R.I.T.A., the Regional Income Tax Agency. You will not receive tax forms in the mail. You can pick up a set of tax forms at the Bremen Village Office (136 Marietta St.) or from the Bremen Library. To ensure timely processing, please use R.I.T.A. 's website at www.ritaohio.com and use the accurate, secure, and FREE E-File service to file and pay your municipal taxes. If you have questions and need to speak with someone, you can call 1-800-860-7482. April 15th is the deadline!!!

A WORD ABOUT YOUR UTILITY BILL: You receive your Utility Bill on the first few days of the month. It is actually due upon receipt. We have so many that wait until the last minute to pay their bill. To be ON TIME your payment must be received by our office before 3 pm on the 20th. If you pay at the Bremen Bank – your payment must be made by the 18th so we can receive it in our office. When paying at the bank YOU MUST have your bill with your account number. NOTE: if you pay your Utility Bill the last week of the month, there is a good chance your payment won't be shown on your bill until the bills go out at the end of the month depending on how the dates fall. Once the system is in the billing mode to print the new Utility Bill – your payment made during the last week of the month may not show.
