Village's 2018 Budget Adopted

Development of the village's 2018 budget was challenging. Operating costs are continually rising while revenue has been flat. Costs include everything needed to run the village such as employee compensation, maintenance of lands, buildings and equipment, utilities, and road asphalt to name just a few examples.

In formulating the budget, both the Financial Process Committee and the entire village council looked at ways to improve efficiencies and reduce spending. Ultimately, however, the budget is limited by the revenue. A very cautious approach was taken in projecting the revenues for the coming year.

To balance the budget, planned spending was slashed for many aspects of the village's operations. This means that much needed highcost infrastructure improvements like street paving, curb/gutter repair, and storm drain and catch basin replacements will need to be deferred.

Following the public hearing on February 28, which gave citizens an opportunity to discuss the proposed budget, the 2018 budget was formally adopted during the special village council meeting.

The revenue side of the budget equation remains a looming issue for the Village.

Just One More Volunteer Needed for the Village Tree Board



Thanks to several village residents stepping forward during the past month, it appears the Tree Board *might* have new life. All we need is just one more person to become a member.

This is the committee

responsible for making decisions about managing the village's street trees.

If not enough people step forward to serve on the tree board, then the village council will need to consider options such as eliminating the board and assigning those responsibilities to another committee such as Safety & Infrastructure.

The Door-to-Door Bremen Income Survey is Underway

Just three quick easy questions and you're done...



We are now gathering the data needed for determining whether the Village is eligible to receive certain state and federal funds and lowinterest loans that would help pay for projects to improve streets, sidewalks, sewers and other infrastructure.

The method for conducting the survey information is following a standard procedure prescribed by the federal government.

The workers who are conducting the door-to-door survey can be identified by a Village-issued photo identification badge.

The questions for each household are very brief and generic, and the results will be compiled in a manner that will summarize the community-wide income status, not tied to specific persons or names.

Information gathered will be handled confidentially and not be utilized for any purpose other than producing the statistics needed to characterize the community's income status.

Your participation will be very much appreciated and may enable us to eventually move forward on some much-needed infrastructure projects.
