# **Storm Sewer Separation Project**

Our crews are continuing on the multi-year project to create separate pipeline systems for stormwater drainage and wastewater drainage.

As with most old towns, the original pipeline system conveyed both road drainage and household sewage together. The EPA has mandated that all municipalities across the USA must create separate systems.

Village of Bremen is on schedule to complete the work in 2016.

The two immediate areas of focus for this year are at the south end of Mulberry Street and on Maple Street between School and Bartlett.

Installation of the Maple Street section is anticipated to occur this month (October). This work will cause short-term, temporary disruptions to residents and traffic in this vicinity.

## Out of Sight, Out of Mind

The purpose of this article is to raise awareness of property owners about an often overlooked aspect of planning for their property maintenance expenses.

Whenever a residence or commercial building is constructed in Bremen, the project includes installation of a water supply line and a sewage waste line that connects the private property to the town's systems. Those service lines are the property owner's responsibility to install and maintain, starting at the Village's main line.

Most of the homes and buildings in Bremen were constructed at least fifty years ago, with many dating back 100 years or so. As such, their sewer and water service pipelines are also that old.

The older properties were plumbed with galvanized steel pipes and the sewage lines were made using twofoot sections of clay tile pipe.



Over the decades, the galvanized pipe tends to

become corroded to the point of diminishing water quality, constricting the internal opening



which reduces water flow, and/or weakening the pipe wall which can result in leaks. Aging clay tile lines are susceptible to a variety of problems including improper slope due to ground settling, broken sections, and clogs by

debris, sediment buildup and plant roots that find their way in at the seams between pipe segments.

The point here is that property owners should remember to undertake routine maintenance of



these systems, and to budget for potential repairs and replacements just as one would for maintaining the condition of things like the roof and gutters, exterior paint and sidewalks.
